**DECISION AND ORDER**

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STATE ETHICS  
COMMISSION

This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission by virtue of a complaint filed by the State Ethics Commission on November 14, 2011. On January 18, 2012, pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §8-13-320(10)(i)(Supp. 2011), the State Ethics Commission reviewed the above-captioned complaint charging Respondent, Eugene O. Boyd, with one violation of Section 8-13-1110 and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing.

Present at the Hearing on March 21, 2012 were Commission Members Edward E. Duryea, Chair, George Carlton Manley and JB Holeman. Respondent was not present but was duly noticed. Complainant was represented by Cathy L. Hazelwood, General Counsel. The following charge was considered:

**COUNT ONE**  
**FAILURE TO FILE A STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTEREST REPORT**  
**SECTION 8-13-1110, S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED**

That the Respondent, Eugene O. Boyd, a member of the Chester County School District's Board of Trustees, did fail to timely file an annual Statement of Economic Interests form on or before April 15, 2011.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

1. The Respondent, Eugene O. Boyd, is a member of the Chester County School District's Board of Trustees, and he must file an annual Statement of Economic Interests form (SEI) on or before April 15, of each year.

2. Commission Investigator Dan Choate testified that Respondent received letters dated August 26, 2011 and October 7, 2011 telling him to file his SEI and pay his late-filing penalty. Investigator Choate testified that on November 29, 2011 he spoke with Respondent concerning the late SEI and penalties levied. Respondent reported that he was having difficulty with the online filing process and he would contact the Commission of-  
fice for assistance. On November 30, 2011 Respondent filed the proper SEI. The out-standing penalty remains at \$3400.00.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Based upon the Findings of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. During all times relevant, the Respondent, Eugene O. Boyd, was a candidate as de-fined by Section 8-13-1300(4).

2. The State Ethics Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction

3. Sections 8-13-1110 and 8-13-1140 provides that certain public officials shall file a Statement of Economic Interests at the time of assuming the duties of the position and an-nually thereafter prior to April 15.

4. Section 8-13-1510(1) provides as follows:

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, a person re-quired to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report or fails to file a required statement or report must be assessed a civil penalty as follows:

(1) a fine of one hundred dollars if not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter;

(2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each additional calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.

5. Section 8-13-320(10)(l)

(i) requiring the public official, public member, or public employee to pay a civil penalty of not more than two thousand dollars for each violation.

**DECISION**

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the State Ethics Commission has determined based upon a preponderance of evidence that Respondent Eugene O. Boyd is in violation of Section 8-13-1110; and therefore, Respondent Eugene O. Boyd is hereby PUBLICLY REPRIMANDED and he is assessed a reduced late-filing penalty of \$500.00 to be paid within 30 days of receipt of the order. If the reduced late-filing penalty of \$500.00 is not paid within 30 days of receipt of the order, then the late-filing penalty will revert to the full amount of \$3,400.00 and an administrative fee of \$500.00 is HEREBY ASSESSED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to Section 8-13-320, a Judgment in the amount of \$3,900.00 is, and shall be entered against Respondent, if he fails to pay within the time permitted.


IT IS FURTHER THE ORDER OF THIS COMMISSION that the Clerk of Court of the County in which Respondent was last known to reside shall enter this Order in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the State Ethics Commission, in the amount of \$3,900.00

upon the Commission's filing of same with the Clerk of Court's Office.

FINALLY, Respondent Eugene O. Boyd has ten (10) days from receipt of this order to appeal this Decision and Order to the full Commission.
