Records in the State Ethics Commission indicate that the Respondent was required to file the 2021 Statement of Economic Interests.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirement by a certified letter dated March 30, 2022 as described in the attached. In addition, an email reminder was sent thirty days prior to the deadline. To date, a 2021 Statement of Economic Interests has not been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1140, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record.

NOTICE OF HEARING

The State Ethics Commission has determined that there is probable cause pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, in the above-captioned complaint. The Commission will convene a formal hearing into the matter in accordance with Section 8-13-320(10)(i) & (j), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.) on Thursday, October 19, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. at the Commission Hearing Room located at: 201 Executive Center Drive, Suite 150, Columbia, South Carolina 29210.

The following allegation will be heard:

COUNT ONE
FAILURE TO FILE STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS
SECTION 8-13-1140, S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED

That Charles T. Hudson, Jr., former Cottage Town Councilmember, did in Richland County, fail to file a 2021 Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Section 8-13-1140.

You have the right to be represented by counsel, the right to call and examine witnesses, the right to introduce exhibits, and the right to cross-examine opposing witnesses. This hearing will be open to the public as required by Section 8-13-320(10)(j), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended. The procedures to be followed are set forth in the Administrative Procedures

Act, Section 1-23-10, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976 as amended the State Ethics Act, Section 8-13-100, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.).

A pre-hearing conference may be scheduled prior to the hearing to allow exchange of witness lists and evidence, marking of exhibits, and disposition of motions or pleadings. In the event you fail to appear, judgment by default will be rendered against you. CONSENT ORDER

This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a Complaint filed on August 31, 2022. Pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i) of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act (Ethics Act), the Complaint against Charles T. Hudson, Jr. (Respondent) was considered by the Commission and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing on one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1140 for failure to timely a 2021 Statement of Economic Interests (SEI). Prior to the call of the case, Respondent agreed to the following:

STATEMENTS OF FACT

1. At all times relevant, Respondent served on the Cottageville Town Council (Council). Respondent resigned from Council on April 26, 2021.
2. On March 29, 2021, Respondent filed a 2020 SEI.¹ However, Respondent did not file a 2021 SEI on or before March 30, 2021.
3. In a March 30, 2022 certified letter, the Commission notified Respondent of his failure to timely file a 2021 SEI.
4. According to the United States Postal Service, the certified letter was delivered to Respondent’s address of record on April 1, 2022 at 12:55 p.m.

¹ Respondent was penalized for this untimely filing through the Commission’s non-compliance process.

5. On April 11, 2022, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$10 per day.
6. On April 21, 2022, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$100 per day.
7. On September 3, 2021, the day he received the Complaint, Respondent filed his 2021 SEI. At the time he came into compliance, Respondent had accrued \$5,000 in late-filing penalties.
8. A Commission Investigator subsequently contacted Respondent. Respondent advised the Investigator that his wife was seriously ill in early 2021, which prompted his resignation from Council. Respondent acknowledged his responsibility to file and apologized for his lack of diligence in this matter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Statements of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. At all times relevant, Respondent was a “public official” pursuant to Section 8-13-100(27).
Therefore, the Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction.
2. Section 8-13-1140 provides, in relevant part:

A person required to file a [SEI] under this chapter annually shall file . . . an updated statement for the previous calendar year, no later than noon on March 30 . . .
3. Section 8-13-1510(A) provides:

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, a person required to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report or fails to file a required statement or report must be assessed a civil penalty as follows: (1) a fine of one hundred dollars if the statement or report is not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter; and (2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each additional calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.
4. Section 8-13-130 allows the Commission to “levy an enforcement or administrative fee on a person who is in violation” of the Ethics Act.

DISCUSSION

The Commission found probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1140 for failing to timely file his 2021 SEI. Through this Consent Order, Respondent acknowledges he violated the Ethics Act when he failed to timely file his 2021 SEI. As mitigation, Respondent offers the following:

My apologies I would never intentionally disregard my filing requirements. The certified letter I received on 3/30/2022 I thought was a mistake and prompted me to go online and look at what filings needed to be completed and the website showed I needed to complete filings for the past years I wasn't on Council which to me confirmed it was a mistake but I was wrong. I resigned in April of 2021 due to my wife's health issue and she was diagnosed in August of 2021 with acute liver failure and in January o[f] 2022 the company I had been with for the last 14 years changed my position and cut my pay by 24K per year . . . If you look at my filing history I think I've been on top of everything, again my apologies[.]

DISPOSITION

1. The Commission hereby finds Respondent in violation of one (1) count of Section 8-13-1140.
2. The Commission hereby adopts the Statements of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Discussion, and Disposition as agreed upon by the Respondent.

THEREFORE, the Commission hereby issues a written warning and orders the Respondent to pay the Commission, within six (6) months from receipt of this Order, a reduced late-filing penalty of \$300 and an administrative fee of \$300, for a total of \$600. The Commission declines to assess the remaining \$4,700 in accrued late-filing penalties.


By executing this Consent Order, Respondent understands that he is not only admitting to violations of the Ethics Act, but also confessing to a judgment of \$600 (less any money paid to the Commission) in the event he does not make full and timely payment as provided for in this Order. In that event, the Commission shall file a Judgment against Respondent in the Clerk of Court's

Office in the County of Respondent's last known residence. Upon said filing, the Clerk of Court shall enter this Order in the amount of \$600 (less any money paid to the Commission) in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the Commission.
