Section 8-13-1120, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires disclosure of the source, type, and amount of income from a governmental entity and a listing of the private source and type of any income received by the filer or a member of the filer's immediate family during the reporting period. Respondent has not reported income on the 2020 and 2021 Statement of Economic Interests.

Section 8-13-1140, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires the filing of an updated Statement of Economic Interests for the previous calendar year annually thereafter prior to March 30. Records in the State Ethics Commission indicate that the Respondent was required to file the 2019 Statement of Economic Interests.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirements by letters dated September 26, 2022 and December 5, 2022 as described in the attached. In addition, an email reminder was sent thirty days prior to the deadline. To date, a 2019 Statement of Economic Interests and properly completed 2020 and 2021 Statement of Economic Interests have not been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1120 and Section 8-13-1140, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record.

The State Ethics Commission has determined that there is probable cause pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, in the above-captioned complaint. The following allegations will be heard:

COUNT ONE
FAILURE TO FILE STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS
SECTION 8-13-1140, S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED

That Danielle W. Fields, Greenwood County School District 50 Board Member, did in Richland County, fail to file a 2019 Statement of Economic Interests (SEI), in violation of Section 8-13-1140.

COUNT TWO
FAILURE TO REPORT INCOME ON STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS
SECTION 8-13-1120(A)(10) S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED

That Danielle W. Fields, Greenwood County School District 50 Board Member, did in

Richland County, fail to report Respondent's private income on her 2020 and 2021 SEIs, in violation of Section 8-13-1120(A)(10).

You have the right to be represented by counsel, the right to call and examine witnesses, the right to introduce exhibits, and the right to cross-examine opposing witnesses. This hearing will be open to the public as required by Section 8-13-320(10)(j), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended. The procedures to be followed are set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, Section 1-23-10, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, the State Ethics Act, Section 8-13-100, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.).

A pre-hearing conference may be scheduled prior to the hearing to allow exchange of witness lists and evidence, marking of exhibits, and disposition of motions or pleadings. In the event you fail to appear, judgment by default will be rendered against you. This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a Complaint filed on March 20, 2023. Pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i) of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act (Ethics Act), the Complaint against Danielle W. Fields (Respondent) was considered by the Commission and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing. Prior to the call of the case, Respondent agreed to the following:

STATEMENTS OF FACT

1. Respondent was elected to Greenwood County School District Board of Trustees on November 6, 2018. Respondent timely filed a 2018 Statement of Economic Interests (SEI).
2. Respondent did not file a 2019 SEI on or before March 30, 2019.
3. On September 26, 2022, the Commission mailed a certified letter to Respondent’s address of record notifying Respondent of her failure to file a 2019 SEI.
4. On December 1, 2022, the certified letter was returned as “Return to Sender – Unclaimed.”
5. On December 5, 2022, the certified letter was re-mailed first class with a United States Postal Service (USPS) tracking number.
6. According to USPS records, the first-class letter was delivered on December 7, 2022 at 5:24 p.m.
7. On December 17, 2022, penalties began accruing at \$10 per day.
8. On December 27, 2022, penalties began accruing at \$100 per day.
9. After no response, the Complaint was filed on March 20, 2023.

10. On May 2, 2023, Respondent received assistance from Commission staff in filing her 2019 SEI and is now in compliance.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Statements of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. At all times relevant, Respondent was a “public official” pursuant to Section 8-13-100(27). Therefore, the Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction.
2. Section 8-13-1140 provides, in relevant part:

A person required to file a [SEI] under this chapter annually shall file . . . an updated statement for the previous calendar year, no later than noon on March 30 . . .

3. Section 8-13-1510(A) provides:

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, a person required to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report or fails to file a required statement or report must be assessed a civil penalty as follows: (1) a fine of one hundred dollars if the statement or report is not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter; and (2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each additional calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.

4. Section 8-13-130 allows the Commission to “levy an enforcement or administrative fee on a person who is in violation” of the Ethics Act.

DISCUSSION

The Commission found probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1140 for failing to file a 2019 SEI.¹ Through this Consent Order, Respondent acknowledges she violated the Ethics Act when she failed to file a 2019 SEI. In mitigation, Respondent states this was her first time in public office, and she was confused about the filing process. She further

¹ The Commission also found probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of 8-13-1120(A)(10) for failing to report Respondent’s private income on her 2020 and 2021 SEIs. Because Respondent has since disclosed her private income, the Commission declines to pursue this charge.

states she did not receive Commission's certified or first-class letters.

DISPOSITION

1. The Commission finds Respondent in violation of one (1) count of 8-13-1140.
2. The Commission hereby adopts the Statements of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Discussion, and Disposition as agreed upon by the Respondent.


THEREFORE, the Commission hereby issues a public reprimand and orders the Respondent to pay the Commission, within six (6) months from receipt of this Order, a late-filing penalty of \$300 and an administrative fee of \$250, for a total of \$550.

By executing this Consent Order, Respondent understands that she is not only admitting to violations of the Ethics Act, but also confessing to a judgment of \$550 (less any money paid to the Commission) in the event she does not make full and timely payment as provided for in this Order. In that event, the Commission shall file a Judgment against Respondent in the Clerk of Court's Office in the County of Respondent's last known residence. Upon said filing, the Clerk of Court shall enter this Order in the amount of \$550 (less any money paid to the Commission) in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the Commission.
