Section 8-13-1140, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires the filing of an updated Statement of Economic Interests for the previous calendar year annually thereafter prior to March 30. Records in the State Ethics Commission indicate that the Respondent was required to file the 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 Statement of Economic Interests.

Section 8-13-1308, S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires candidates to file Campaign Disclosures within ten (10) days of receiving or expending \$500; fifteen (15) days prior to each election; within ten (10) days of the end of each quarter; and a final report when the campaign account is closed. In addition, certified campaign reports detailing campaign contributions and expenditures must contain the total of contributions accepted, the name and address of each person making a contribution, the total expenditures made by or on behalf of the candidate or committee, and the name and address of each person to whom an expenditure is made from campaign funds. Pursuant to Section 8-13-1362 and Regulation 52-504 (C), the Pre-Election and quarterly report are required even when there have been no contributions or expenditures. Records of the State Ethics Commission indicate that a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure was due between October 19, 2022 and October 24, 2022.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirement by letters dated December 19, 2022 and January 23, 2023 as described in the attached. To date, a properly completed 2019 Statement of Economic Interests, 2020 Statement of Economic Interests, 2021 Statement of Economic Interests, 2022 Statement of Economic Interests, and Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure have not been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1140, Section 8-13-1308(A), Section 8-13-1308(D)(1), and Section 8-13-1308 (F), S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record.

CONSENT ORDER

This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a Complaint filed on March 20, 2023. Pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i) of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act (Ethics Act), the Complaint against Sandra G. Sloan (Respondent) was considered by the Commission and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing. Prior to the call of the case, Respondent agreed to the following:

STATEMENTS OF FACT

1. Respondent has served on Oconee County School Board (Board) since her November 6, 2018 election. Respondent's most recent election was on November 8, 2022.
2. Respondent failed to file a 2019 Statement of Economic Interests (SEI) prior to taking oath of office. Respondent thereafter failed to file her annual SEI on or before March 30 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.
3. Prior to her November 8, 2022 election, Respondent failed to file a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure Report (CDR).
4. In a January 25, 2023 first-class letter, the Commission sent Respondent notice of her failure to file a 2022 Pre-Election CDR and SEIs for 2019-2022.
5. According to the United States Postal Service, the letter was picked up at the post office on

January 27, 2023 at 2:18 p.m.

6. After the filing of the Complaint, the Commission's investigation revealed that Respondent opened a campaign bank account in August 2022 and reached a \$500.00 accumulated aggregate on October 11, 2022. The investigation further revealed that the campaign bank account remained active until reaching a zero-dollar balance in June 2023.
7. Respondent failed to file her 2023 SEI by March 30, 2023.
8. On September 19, 2024, Respondent filed her 2019-2023 SEIs.
9. On September 23, 2024, Respondent filed her missing CDRs and is now in compliance.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Statements of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. At all times relevant, Respondent was a candidate pursuant to Section 8-13-1300(4) and a public official pursuant to Section 8-13-100(27) of the Ethics Act. Therefore, the Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction.
2. Section 8-13-1308 provides, in relevant part:
 - (A) Upon the receipt or expenditure of campaign contributions or the making of independent expenditures totaling an accumulated aggregate of five hundred dollars or more, a candidate or committee required to file a statement of organization pursuant to Section 8-13-1304(A) must file an initial certified campaign report within ten days of these initial receipts or expenditures. However, a candidate who does not receive or expend campaign contributions totaling an accumulated aggregate of five hundred dollars or more must file an initial certified campaign report fifteen days before an election.
 - (B) Following the filing of an initial certified campaign report, additional certified campaign reports must be filed within ten days following the end of each calendar quarter in which contributions are received or expenditures are made, whether before or after an election until the campaign account undergoes final disbursement pursuant to the provisions of Section 8-13-1370.

....

(D)(1) At least fifteen days before an election, a certified campaign report must be filed showing contributions of more than one hundred dollars and expenditures to or by the candidate or committee for the period ending twenty days before the election. The candidate or committee must maintain a current list during the period before the election commencing at the beginning of the calendar quarter of the election of all contributions of more than one hundred dollars and expenditures. The list must be open to public inspection upon request.

3. Section 8-13-1140 provides, in relevant part:

A person required to file a [SEI] under this chapter annually shall file, pursuant to Section 8-13-365, an updated statement for the previous calendar year, no later than noon on March thirtieth of each calendar year . . .

4. Section 8-13-1510(A) provides:

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, a person required to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report or fails to file a required statement or report must be assessed a civil penalty as follows: (1) a fine of one hundred dollars if the statement or report is not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter; and (2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each additional calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.

5. Section 8-13-130 allows the Commission to “levy an enforcement or administrative fee on a person who is in violation” of the Ethics Act.

DISCUSSION

The Commission found probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1308(A) for failing to file a 2022 Initial CDR; one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1308(D) for failing to file a 2022 Pre-Election/Quarter 3 CDR; three (3) counts of violating Section 8-13-1308(B) for failing to file a 2022 Quarter 4 CDR, 2023 Quarter 1 CDR, and 2023 Quarter 2/Final CDR; and five (5) counts of violating Section 8-13-1140 for failing to file

2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023 SEIs.¹

Through this Consent Order, Respondent acknowledges she violated the Ethics Act as described herein. In mitigation, Respondent states that she was not familiar with the filing requirements and found it difficult to navigate the Commission's complaint process. To that end, Respondent asserts that she suffers from debilitating anxiety, which has made it difficult for her to travel, be in enclosed spaces, and complete tasks at work. She states that while she has long dealt with the anxiety, it appears to have worsened as she has gotten older and impacted her ability to come into compliance. Finally, Respondent asserts that she was a caretaker for her stepfather who had dementia until he passed ten months ago, that she is a caretaker for her mother who has had dementia for the past two years, and that she now financially supports her mother.

DISPOSITION

1. The Commission hereby finds Respondent in violation of the Ethics Act as set forth herein.
2. The Commission hereby adopts the Statements of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Discussion, and Disposition as agreed upon by the Respondent.

THEREFORE, the Commission hereby issues a Public Reprimand and orders the Respondent to pay the Commission, within eighteen (18) months from receipt of this Order, a late-filing penalty of \$1,000.00 (\$100.00 for each report) and an administrative fee of \$500.00, for a total of \$1,500.00.

By executing this Consent Order, Respondent understands that she is not only admitting to violations of the Ethics Act, but also confessing to a judgment of \$1,500.00 (less any money paid

to the Commission) in the event she does not make full and timely payment as provided for in this Order. In that event, the Commission shall file a Judgment against Respondent in the Clerk of Court's Office in the County of Respondent's last known residence. Upon said filing, the Clerk of Court shall enter this Order in the amount of \$1,500.00 (less any money paid to the Commission) in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the Commission.²
