Section 8-13-1308, S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires candidates to file Campaign Disclosures within ten (10) days of receiving or expending \$500; fifteen (15) days prior to each election; within ten (10) days of the end of each quarter; and a final report when the campaign account is closed. In addition, certified campaign reports detailing campaign contributions and expenditures must contain the total of contributions accepted, the name and address of each person making a contribution, the total expenditures made by or on behalf of the candidate or committee, and the name and address of each person to whom an expenditure is made from campaign funds. Pursuant to Section 8-13-1362 and Regulation 52-504 (C), the Pre-Election and quarterly report are required even when there have been no contributions or expenditures.

Records of the State Ethics Commission indicate that a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure was due between October 16, 2019 and October 21, 2019. Respondent was sent an email reminder thirty days before the Campaign Disclosure deadline.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirement by letters dated October 28, 2022, December 21, 2022, and January 11, 2023 as described in the attached. To date, a properly completed Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure has not been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1308(A), Section 8-13-1308(D)(1), and Section 8-13-1308 (F), S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record.

**COUNT ONE**  
**FAILURE TO FILE A PRE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE REPORT**  
**SECTION 8-13-1308(A), S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED**

That Travis S. Blissett, Candidate for North Charleston City Council, did in Richland County, fail to file a 2019 Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure Report, in violation of Section 8-13-1308(A).

You have the right to be represented by counsel, the right to call and examine witnesses, the right to introduce exhibits, and the right to cross-examine opposing witnesses. This hearing will be open to the public as required by Section 8-13-320(10)(j), Code of Laws, South Carolina,

1976, as amended. The procedures to be followed are set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, Section 1-23-10, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, the State Ethics Act, Section 8-13-100, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.).

A pre-hearing conference may be scheduled prior to the hearing to allow exchange of witness lists and evidence, marking of exhibits, and disposition of motions or pleadings. In the event you fail to appear, judgment by default will be rendered against you. **CONSENT ORDER**

This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a Complaint filed on March 24, 2023. Pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i) of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act (Ethics Act), the Complaint against Travis S. Blissett (Respondent) was considered by the Commission and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing. Prior to the call of the case, Respondent agreed to entry of the following:

**STATEMENTS OF FACT**

1. Respondent was an unsuccessful candidate for North Charleston City Council in a November 5, 2019 election.
2. Respondent did not file a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure (CDR) prior to the election.
3. In a January 11, 2023 certified letter, the Commission notified Respondent of his failure to file a 2019 Pre-Election CDR.<sup>1</sup>
4. According to the United States Postal Service, the certified letter was delivered to Respondent on January 26, 2023 at 9:25 a.m. The return receipt contains Respondent’s signature. That same day, Commission staff members spoke with Respondent in regard to the penalty, appeal process, and assistance with filing his Pre-Election CDR.
5. On February 5, 2023, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$10.00 per day.

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<sup>1</sup> The Commission unsuccessfully attempted to notify Respondent of his failure to file a 2019 Pre-Election CDR via certified letters dated October 28, 2022 and December 21, 2022. After both letters were returned due to issues with Respondent’s address, the Commission ran a CLEAR report to determine Respondent’s updated address before sending its letter dated January 11, 2023.

6. On February 15, 2023, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$100.00 per day.
7. On October 18, 2023, following the filing of the Complaint, Respondent accepted service of the Complaint via email after speaking with Commission staff. Respondent also scheduled an appointment with Commission staff to receive assistance with filing his Pre-Election CDR.
8. On November 30, 2023, Respondent filed his 2019 Pre-Election CDR with help from Commission staff and is now in compliance.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Statements of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. At all times relevant, Respondent was a “candidate” pursuant to Section 8-13-1300(4). Therefore, the Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction.
2. Section 8-13-1308(A) provides, in relevant part:

. . . a candidate who does not receive or expend campaign contributions totaling an accumulated aggregate of five hundred dollars or more must file an initial certified campaign report fifteen days before an election.
3. Section 8-13-1510(A) provides:

. . . a person required to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report . . . must be assessed a civil penalty as follows: (1) a fine of one hundred dollars if the statement or report is not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter; and (2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each additional calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.
4. Section 8-13-130 allows the Commission to “levy an enforcement or administrative fee on a person who is in violation” of the Ethics Act.

### DISCUSSION

The Commission found probable cause to charge Respondent with one (1) count of violating Section 8-13-1308(A) for failing to file a 2019 Pre-Election CDR. Through this Consent Order, Respondent admits he failed to timely file a 2019 Pre-Election CDR. In mitigation, Respondent states he believed he was not required to file a Pre-Election CDR because he had no campaign contributions or expenditures.

Respondent acknowledges he violated the Ethics Act and further states 2019 was his first fun for public office and he was unfamiliar with the filing requirements.

**DISPOSITION**

1. The Commission finds Respondent in violation of one (1) count of Section 8-13-1308(A) for failing to file his 2019 Pre-Election CDR.
2. The Commission adopts the Statements of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Discussion, and Disposition as agreed upon by the Respondent.

THEREFORE, the Commission hereby issues this written warning to Respondent, and orders Respondent to pay the Commission, within nine (9) months from receipt of this Order, a reduced late-filing penalty of \$350.00 and an administrative fee of \$450.00, for a total of \$800.00.

By executing this Consent Order, Respondent understands that he is not only admitting to a violation of the Ethics Act, but also confessing to a judgment of \$800.00 in the event he does not make payment as provided for in this Order, in which case the Commission shall file a Judgment against Respondent with the County Clerk of Court in Respondent's last known County of residence, who shall enter this Order in the amount of \$800.00 (less any money paid) in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the Commission.
