Section 8-13-1308, S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires candidates to file Campaign Disclosures within ten (10) days of receiving or expending \$500; fifteen (15) days prior to each election; within ten (10) days of the end of each quarter; and a final report when the campaign account is closed. In addition, certified campaign reports detailing campaign contributions and expenditures must contain the total of contributions accepted, the name and address of each person making a contribution, the total expenditures made by or on behalf of the candidate or committee, and the name and address of each person to whom an expenditure is made from campaign funds.

Records of the State Ethics Commission indicate that a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure was due no later between October 18, 2017 and October 23, 2017. Respondent was sent an email reminder thirty days before the Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure deadline.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirement by letters dated October 19, 2018, December 17, 2018, February 26, 2019, April 10, 2019, July 12, 2019, and February 20, 2020 as described in the attached. To date, no properly completed Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure has been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1308(D)(1) and Section 8-13-1308 (F), S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

All investigations, inquiries, hearings, and accompanying documents must remain confidential unless respondent waives the right to confidentiality. If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record. The willful release of confidential information is a misdemeanor, and any person releasing such confidential information, upon conviction, must be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or imprisoned not more than one year. Section 8-13-320(10)(g).

The State Ethics Commission has determined that there is probable cause pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, to support the allegations made in the above-captioned complaint. The Commission will convene a formal hearing into the matter in accordance with Section 8-13-320(10)(i) & (j), Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.) on Thursday, April 21, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. at the Commission Hearing Room located at: 201 Executive Center Drive, Suite 150, Columbia, South Carolina 29210.

The following allegations will be heard:

COUNT ONE
FAILURE TO FILE A PRE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE REPORT
SECTION 8-13-1308 S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED

That Keith C. VanWinkle, candidate for Myrtle Beach City Council, did in Richland County, fail to file a 2017 pre-election campaign disclosure report, in violation of Section 8-13-1308.

You have the right to be represented by counsel, the right to call and examine witnesses, the right to introduce exhibits, and the right to cross-examine opposing witnesses. This hearing will be open to the public as required by Section 8-13-320(10)(j), Code of Laws, South Carolina,

1976, as amended. The procedures to be followed are set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, Section 1-23-10, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976 as amended the State Ethics Act, Section 8-13-100, et seq., Code of Laws, South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and State Ethics Commission Regulations, S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 52-707 (1997 Cum. Supp.).

A pre-hearing conference may be scheduled prior to the hearing to allow exchange of witness lists and evidence, marking of exhibits, and disposition of motions or pleadings. In the event you fail to appear, judgment by default will be rendered against you. 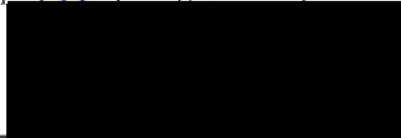

DECISION AND ORDER

LOGGED

This matter comes before the State Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a complaint filed on October 16, 2020. Pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i) of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act of 1991 (Ethics Act), the Commission reviewed the above-captioned complaint against Keith C. VanWinkle (Respondent) and probable cause was found to warrant an evidentiary hearing. Present at the hearing on April 21, 2022, were Commissioners Brandolyn Pinkston, AJ Holloway, and Scott Frick, Hearing Chair. Respondent was duly notified but did not appear. Complainant was represented by Courtney M. Laster. The following charge was considered:

COUNT ONE
FAILURE TO FILE A PRE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE REPORT
SECTION 8-13-1308 S.C. CODE ANN., 1976, AS AMENDED

That Keith C. VanWinkle, candidate for Myrtle Beach City Council, did in Richland County, fail to file a 2017 pre-election campaign disclosure report, in violation of Section 8-13-1308.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Having carefully reviewed the evidence presented, the Commission finds as fact:

1. Respondent was a candidate for Myrtle Beach City Council in a November 7, 2017 election.
2. Respondent did not file a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure Report (CDR) before the election.
3. In an October 19, 2018 first-class letter and a December 17, 2018 certified letter, both mailed to Respondent's address of record at 819 Rogers Drive, the Commission attempted to notify

Respondent of his failure to file a Pre-Election CDR.

4. The Commission received no response to the October 19, 2018 first-class letter. The December 17, 2018 certified letter was returned on January 7, 2019 as “Return to Sender – Attempted – Not Known.”
5. In a February 26, 2019 first-class letter and an April 10, 2019 certified letter, both mailed to 4944 Bass Drive, Conway, SC, the Commission attempted to notify the Respondent of his failure to file a Pre-Election CDR.
6. The Commission received no response to the February 26, 2019 first-class letter. The April 10, 2019 certified letter was returned on April 22, 2019 as “Return to Sender – Not Deliverable as Addressed.”
7. On February 20, 2020, Commission Investigator Kevin Hinson attempted to hand deliver the late-filing penalty letter and spoke with the Respondent’s father and, subsequently, with Respondent. Respondent advised Investigator Hinson that the penalty letter should be mailed to 4944 Bass Drive. Investigator Hinson also emailed Respondent a copy of the letter.
8. In a February 21, 2020 certified letter mailed to 4944 Bass Drive, the Commission notified Respondent of his failure to file a Pre-Election CDR. According to the United States Postal Service, this letter is delivered on February 24, 2020 at 2:16 p.m.
9. On March 5, 2020, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$10 per day. On March 15, 2020, late-filing penalties began to accrue at \$100 per day.
10. On March 9, 2020, Kristin Nabors, the Commission’s Supervisor of Non-Compliance, telephoned Respondent. Ms. Nabors advised Respondent that he needed to file the Pre-Election CDR. Respondent stated he was currently in New York, but would obtain his bank records and complete the filing as necessary. Ms. Nabors advised Respondent that he had until April 10, 2020 to come into compliance or a complaint would be filed.

11. As of the date of the hearing, Respondent had not filed the requisite Pre-Election CDR.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Findings of Fact, the Commission concludes, as a matter of law:

1. At all times relevant, Respondent was a candidate pursuant to Section 8-13-1300(4) of the Ethics Act. Therefore, the Commission has personal and subject matter jurisdiction.

2. Section 8-13-1308 of the Ethics Act provides, in part:

(A) . . . a candidate who does not receive or expend campaign contributions totaling an accumulated aggregate of five hundred dollars or more must file an initial certified campaign report fifteen days before an election.

...

(D) (1) At least fifteen days before an election, a certified campaign report must be filed showing contributions of more than one hundred dollars and expenditures to or by the candidate or committee for the period ending twenty days before the election . . .

3. Section 8-13-1510(A) provides, in part:

. . . a person required to file a report or statement under this chapter who files a late statement or report or fails to file a required statement or report must be assessed a civil penalty as follows: (1) a fine of one hundred dollars if the statement or report is not filed within five days after the established deadline provided by law in this chapter; and (2) after notice has been given by certified or registered mail that a required statement or report has not been filed, a fine of ten dollars per calendar day for the first ten days after notice has been given, and one hundred dollars for each calendar day in which the required statement or report is not filed, not exceeding five thousand dollars.

4. Section 8-13-130 of the Ethics Act allow the Commission to levy an administrative fee on any person who is found in violation of the Ethics Act.

DECISION

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Panel has determined, based on a preponderance of evidence, that Respondent Keith C. VanWinkle is in violation of one (1) count of Section 8-13-1308 for failure to timely file a Pre-Election CDR prior to a November 7, 2017 election.

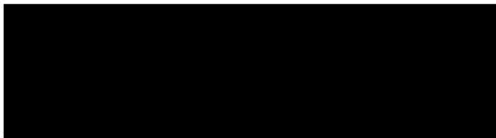
THEREFORE, Respondent is hereby assessed a late-filing penalty of \$5,000, a civil penalty of \$2,000, and an administrative fee of \$800, for a total of \$7,800.

AND, pursuant to Section 8-13-320 of the Ethics Act, if the \$7,800 is not paid within ninety (90) days from Respondent's receipt of this Order, a judgment in the amount of \$7,800 shall be entered against Respondent. In the event of a failure to pay, upon the Commission's filing of said Judgment with the Clerk of Court's Office in the County of Respondent's last known residence, the Clerk of Court shall enter this Order in the amount of \$7,800 in its Judgment Rolls, without cost to the Commission.

FINALLY, Respondent Keith C. VanWinkle, has ten (10) days from receipt of this Order to appeal this Decision and Order to the full Commission.

October 19, 2018: \$100.00 penalty assessed for failure to file a Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure between October 18, 2017 and October 23, 2017. The letter is sent to 819 Rogers Drive, the address in his candidate profile.

December 17, 2018: The penalty letter is sent certified.

January 7, 2019: The certified letter is returned as "Return to Sender – Attempted – Not Known"

February 26, 2019: The penalty letter is sent to 4944 Bass Drive, his address of record according to a CLEAR report.

April 10, 2019: The penalty letter is sent certified to 4944 Bass Drive.

April 22, 2019: The certified letter is returned as "Return to Sender – Not Deliverable as Addressed."

July 12, 2019: The penalty letter is sent with a first-class tracking number to 509 67th Avenue North Apt. V, his household listing according to his CLEAR report.

July 29, 2019: The certified letter is returned as "Return to Sender – Not Deliverable as Addressed."

February 20, 2020: Investigator Hinson attempts to hand deliver the late filing penalties and speaks with Mr. VanWinkle's father.

February 21, 2020: Investigator Hinson speaks with Mr. VanWinkle, who indicates he has no physical address. He requests that the letter be sent to 4944 Bass Drive and via e-mail. Mr. VanWinkle acknowledges receipt of the email with the penalty letter.

February 24, 2020: According to the United States Postal Service website, the certified letter is delivered at 2:16 p.m.

March 5, 2020: Kristin Nabors returns his phone call and leaves a voicemail.

Penalties begin accruing at \$10 per day for the first ten days

March 9, 2020: Kristin Nabors returns his phone call and explains that he needs to file the Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure. He is in New York and will get his files. He requested thirty days to respond and was given until April 10th.

March 15, 2020: Penalties begin accruing at \$100 per day

September 1, 2020: Kristin Nabors calls Mr. VanWinkle to follow up and leaves a voicemail.

October 5, 2020: At no point did Mr. VanWinkle have a "Saved Not Filed" Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure. After no response, complaint is filed.

Dear Mr. VanWinkle

As a candidate for City of Myrtle Beach, Horry County School Board, and Horry County Council, the Ethics Reform Act requires you to file certain reports with the State Ethics Commission. An audit of your account indicates the following missing or late reports:

A Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure, which was to be filed prior to October 23, 2017 but no earlier than October 18, 2017, has not been filed as a candidate for City of Myrtle Beach.

A Final Campaign Disclosure was due on January 10, 2016, but was filed on August 23, 2017, as a candidate for Horry County Council.

You were required to file a January 10, 2015, April 10, 2015, October 10, 2015, January 10, 2016, April 10, 2016, July 10, 2016, October 10, 2016, January 10, 2017, April 10, 2017, July 10, 2017, and October 10, 2017 Campaign Disclosure as a candidate for Horry County School Board; however, you failed to file by the established deadlines. Since you filed a Final Campaign Disclosure on July 18, 2017 disclosing the required contributions and expenditures, you will not be required to file additional reports.

In accordance with Section 8-13-1510, South Carolina Code Ann., 1976, as amended, a late filing penalty of \$1,300.00 is hereby levied. If the required Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure is not filed electronically within ten calendar days of receipt of this letter, additional penalties will be levied at \$10 per day for the first ten days and \$100 per day for each additional day until the penalty reaches \$5,000, and a complaint will be filed against you.

If extenuating circumstances prevented you from filing the reports as required, you may file a written appeal of this late filing penalty. To file an appeal, you must do the following within ten (10) days of the date you receive this letter:

- Send a personal check or money order made payable to the State Ethics Commission
- File all missing reports online at <http://ethics.sc.gov>

Provide a written statement describing any extenuating circumstances. If you have closed your campaign account, please provide a copy of your last bank statement to consider a reduction in the late filing penalty.

Please be advised that all appeals must be in writing and must follow the above directions. NO phone or e-mail appeals will be accepted. Failure to file is a misdemeanor. After the maximum civil penalty has been levied, this matter will be referred to Magistrate's Court for criminal prosecution. This matter will also be referred to the South Carolina Department of Revenue for collection, and the penalty amount and your name, address (city) and position will be posted on the State Ethics Commission's website. Please contact this office if we can provide further information.

Please email me when that has been completed and we can discuss next steps.

Someone at the Commission would also be able to provide assistance, if needed. Also, are you planning on attending the April hearing virtually? If so, please provide me a date and time that we can do a test via zoom to make sure that the video/audio connect works. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Sorry for any inconvenience I have been exceptionally ill and have almost died several times due to a severe illness I have been in and out of the hospital for the last 2 and 1/2 years seeking medical treatment at different hospitals. Again I am sorry for any inconvenience it has simply been out of my control. I am still seeking medical treatment and will not be able to attend

the hearing I wish you all the very best I currently have not working I have no income and I am literally living off of friends and family waiting on disability.
