Section 8-13-1120, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended, requires disclosure of the source, type, and amount of income from a governmental entity and a listing of the private source and type of any income received by the filer or a member of the filer's immediate family during the reporting period. Respondent failed to properly report the source of private income on his 2024 Statement of Economic Interests.

Respondent was reminded of the filing requirement by a letter dated May 6, 2024 as described in the attached. To date, a properly amended 2024 Statement of Economic Interests has not been received. All in violation of Section 8-13-1120, SC Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

If there is a finding of probable cause, the following documents become public record: the complaint, the response (if any) by respondent, and the notice of hearing. If a hearing is to be held, the final order and all exhibits become public record. If no hearing is held following a finding of probable cause, the final disposition of the matter becomes public record.

This matter came before the South Carolina Ethics Commission (Commission) by way of a Complaint filed on January 8, 2025. The Commission’s Executive Director reviewed the Complaint, determined it contained facts sufficient to warrant an investigation, and ordered an investigation. On May 15, 2025, the Commission reviewed the Complaint and investigative findings to determine whether probable cause existed to charge Derrick L. Quarles (Respondent) with violating the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act (Ethics Act). For the reasons stated herein, the Commission finds probable cause exists, but waives further proceedings.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

1. Respondent was an unsuccessful candidate for Greenville County Council in a June 11, 2024 primary election.
2. As a partisan candidate, Respondent timely filed a 2024 Statement of Economic Interests (SEI) but failed to properly disclose the source of his private income. Instead of specifically identifying his employer, Respondent listed the source of income as “Employer.”
3. Following the filing of the Complaint, Respondent amended his 2024 SEI to properly identify the source of his private income as “Next Wave Consulting.”

**LAW**

Pursuant to Section 8-13-320, the Commission is empowered to receive complaints and conduct investigations related to violations of the Ethics Act. Following the receipt of a Complaint

and completion of a corresponding investigation, the Commission must determine whether there is probable cause to believe a violation of the Ethics Act occurred. Section 8-13-320(10)(i). If the Commission determines probable cause exists, it may order a hearing on the merits or, if the Respondent has taken action to remedy or correct the alleged violation, it may waive further proceedings. Section 8-13-320(10)(i). The decision to waive further proceedings lies within the sound discretion of the Commission.

Section 8-13-1120(A)(10) of the Ethics Act requires public officials to disclose sources of private income on their SEIs.

**DECISION**

Based on evidence presented, the Commission hereby determines there is probable cause to believe Respondent violated Section 8-13-1120(A)(10) of the Ethics Act by failing to properly disclose the source of his private income on his 2024 SEI. However, given that Respondent has amended his SEI to disclose the source of his private income, the Commission hereby waives further proceedings with regard to this Complaint.

THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 8-13-320(10)(i), and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, the Commission finds probable cause, but waives further proceedings.
